She confiscated the notebook and took it back to her desk. While we were getting our lessons you could watch her looking through it with a smile on her face. We found out later he had penciled portraits of some of the teachers while they were at their desk and gave it to them for Christmas and that teacher was one of them. When I found out of Ed's passing this was one of the first things that came to my mind about him. Its funny how things stick with you and is impressed upon you for the rest of your life. From that time forward he was drawing for everybody, the principal, teachers, the sports teams, cheerleaders and band. All the way through graduation.

I lost contact with Ed a few years after graduation and when we had our class reunions we could never get in touch with him. Everyone would always ask about Ed. We all missed him and as I write this to you my heart really goes out to you. The 1977 graduating class was a small one and we were all close to one another as different as we all were. We all loved one another no matter what, that's for sure. Every time one of my class mates passes I feel a piece of me passes on too and I know the rest of our class feels the same. I'm sure my class mates will agree when I say Ed Varnado is one of our best memories we had from our childhoods at Valley Forge Academy.
