Many troubles, trials, heartaches and grief came her way. She suffered illnesses many times that we thought would take her life, but strength that could only come from the Lord and a strong will to "overcome", she did just that.

As a mother and wife, her life was busy and filled with the needs of her family. In March 1949 she married the love of her life, our father, whom she loved to the very end. In 11 years (1950-1961) she had 10 pregnancies, with 7 surviving. She did not complain about her responsibilities as a wife and mother, but worked hard to meet them every day, diligently. Determination was one of her strongest characteristics. She was challenged with an extremely uneducated life and also legally blind, but never felt disabled or disadvantaged. It was life as she knew it and she loved life! So many life lessons could be found in her character and in the simplicity of the life she lived. She certainly never felt like

she was privileged, but neither did she feel under privileged. You only had to observe her to find "true treasures", of what she found to be a "blessed life". We should surely take note.

An unforgettable person to so many, especially to siblings, to grandkids and great-grandkids and to her loving sons in law, but most of all to those she gave her all to...her children. To us, we can see she was truly all and more of what we needed our mother to be. You taught us so many things in our life, except how to live with the void, this place in our hearts that is only yours and so sadly left behind. Our Love Is Forever.
