"18 So the LORD must wait for you to come to him so he can show you his love and compassion. For the LORD is a faithful God. Blessed are those who wait for his help. 19 O people of Zion, who live in Jerusalem, you will weep no more. He will be gracious if you ask for help.

He will surely respond to the sound of your cries.

20 Though the Lord gave you adversity for food and suffering for drink,
he will still be with you to teach you.
You will see your teacher with your own eyes.

21 Your own ears will hear him.
Right behind you a voice will say,
"This is the way you should go,"
whether to the right or to the left."

Michael was intelligent, honest, and he held himself up with integrity and courage. I cannot imagine the adversity and suffering he had seen and felt over the years, yet he would always greet you with a smile. He firmly understood teamwork, and he would equip you to succeed. He made a point to share and to teach whenever possible.

In Mark 5:24-34, we learned that something as small as a faithful thought could bring healing.

"24 Jesus went with him, and all the people followed, crowding around him. 25 A woman in the crowd had suffered for twelve years with constant bleeding. 26 She had suffered a great deal from many doctors, and over the years she had spent everything she had to pay them, but she had gotten no better. In fact, she had gotten worse. 27 She had heard about Jesus, so she came up behind him through the crowd and touched his robe. 28 For she thought to herself, "If I can just touch his robe, I will be healed." 29 Immediately the bleeding stopped, and she could feel in her body that she had been healed of her terrible condition.

30 Jesus realized at once that healing power had gone out from him, so he turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who touched my robe?"

31 His disciples said to him, "Look at this crowd pressing around you. How can you ask, 'Who touched me?'"

32 But he kept on looking around to see who had done it. 33 Then the frightened woman, trembling at the realization of what had happened to her, came and fell to her knees in front of him and told him what she had done. 34 And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well. Go in peace. Your suffering is over."" I knew Michael had a daughter whom he loved dearly, and if you could slow him down, he would share a story with you. I imagine she, like all of us, may be going thru a trial as well. As we read in scripture, Jesus wants to heal us. Jesus wants us to be overwhelmed with faith, just like the woman in this story. This glimpse of history stands as a lesson to us all today. Keep Michael's daughter in your prayers and have faith in the Lord healing her heart.

In 2 Timothy 4:17-18, we learned of Paul even at the end of his life here on earth: "17 But the Lord stood with me and gave me strength so that I might preach the Good News in its entirety for all the Gentiles to hear. And he rescued me from certain death.[b] 18 Yes, and the Lord will deliver me from every evil attack and will bring me safely into his heavenly Kingdom…"

I knew Michael was a veteran. He selflessly served our God and our country for many years. I can't imagine how often God has rescued him (and all our veterans)

from "certain death," yet God always brings his children safe and sound into his Kingdom. Whether it is towards a Kingdom purpose here on earth, or the final Kingdom in heaven.
