And a resident of Cottonport, LA died Sunday morning April 19, 2020 at the Rapides Regional Medical Center in Alexandria. He was a 1988 graduate of Bowling Green School where he played on the Buccaneer football team that won a State Championship. Casey later graduated from the University of Southern Mississippi in 1994 before attending the LSU School of Medicine in Shreveport where he received his Medical Doctorate in 1999. He was currently serving as the Director of Medicine for the Raymond Laborde Correctional Center in Cottonport. Casey loved riding his four-wheel ATV and he was an avid New Orleans Saints fan.
