As a member of First Baptist Church in Franklinton, she was an organized, humble, behind-the-scenes tireless worker, always willing to volunteer to serve her church and community. She did volunteer work in VBS at several

local churches, worked as a part time secretary for Trinity Baptist Church and the Baptist Mission Office, and served on a Wednesday Night Supper Group at First Baptist Church. She was an excellent cook, and enjoyed feeding others especially the local pastors at their monthly meetings at the Baptist Mission Office. She was affectionately known as “The Food Bank Lady”, having served as volunteer director of the Washington Parish Food Bank for 12 years.
