Debbie Simmons, of Cleveland, MS died at the University of Alabama at Birmingham Hospital on February 26, 2007 while awaiting a transplant. Debbie graduated from Woodlawn High School in Baton Rouge, LA and attended Southeastern Louisiana University in Hammond, LA where she met and later married her husband of twenty-seven years. Debbie completed her Bachelors degree in Social Work from Delta State University in 1990 after moving to Cleveland from Germany in 1987 Debbie was employed by the state of Mississippi at the Bolivar County Health Department as a Social Worker upon her death.
