FRANKIE PENNY, AGE 96

A resident of Mt. Hermon died Wednesday, September 3, 2014 at Heritage Manor Nursing Home. She loved crocheting, gardening, quilting and traveling. She belonged to the Mt. Hermon Garden Club and the Bogue Chitto Homemakers Club.

She was a member of Mt. Hermon Baptist Church. She was a retired registered nurse of over 30 years, having been employed at Pikes Medical Center in Kentwood for the majority of her career.

She was also the last living Real Daughter of the Sons of the Confederate Veteran of Louisiana. Her father enlisted in the Civil War at Camp Moore on May 13, 1862 and fought with the 3rd Louisiana Calvary.
