



## Bro. Harry McIntyre

June 28, 1927 - November 15, 2015

REVERAND HARRY DELBERT McINTYRE, AGE 88

And a resident of Enon went home to be with his Lord at 2:25 pm on the beautiful Sunday afternoon November 15, 2015. Brother Harry, as he was fondly known, was born June 28, 1927 in the Great Southern Lumber camps of Georgetown, MS. Four years later, the camps moved to Enon, LA where he and his sister, Mary Louise, lived with Emma and David Corkern as much loved foster children. Harry went to school at Enon High School, and joined the Marines during the latter part of World War II. He served in the Marine Corps from 1945 through 1948, primarily in the clean-up of China.

Bro. Harry returned to Enon, worked on tug boats and at the Gaylord Paper Mill until he was ordained as a Baptist minister at Enon Baptist Church. He then received his B.A. in Theology from Mississippi College in Clinton, MS and later received his M.Ed from Southeastern Louisiana University. Bro. Harry pastored several churches in Washington Parish and Mississippi and also taught fifth grade at Folsom Elementary for more than 20 years. He spent his retirement years residing in Enon and remained a member of Enon Baptist Church.
