Passed away on Saturday, November 17, 2007 at Heritage Manor of Mandeville. Mrs. Allard was born to Gordon Woodward Carpenter and Flossie Pearl Wells Carpenter on November 8, 1913 in Knox City, TX. She also had four younger brothers – Charles Gordon Carpenter, Colonel Benoit Woodward Carpenter, Benjamin Carpenter, and Arthur Carpenter. She was the stepdaughter of Helen Carpenter.

Myriam married Morris Sheppard Allard on November 18, 1933. They had three children-Marilyn Jean Allard Richardson of Franklinton, LA, Joe Gordon Allard of Lubbock, TX, and Sara Helen Allard Smith of Mandeville, LA. Mrs. Allard was a past member of the Gentilly Boulevard Church of Christ, Carrollton Avenue Church of Christ, Forest Park Church of Christ, and Bogalusa Church of Christ. She

was also a member of several organizations, including Daughters of the American Revolution, United Daughters of the Confederacy, Colonial Dames, Daughters of 1812, and the Covington Garden Club. In 1971, Mrs. Allard was awarded the Louisiana DAR Civics Teacher of the Year.
