Mrs. Robin Carol Dunigan, age 61, passed away peacefully on Friday May 9, 2025 in Covington, Louisiana, surrounded by the love of her family and the grace of her faith.

Born on January 31, 1964, in Carthage, Mississippi, Robin was a devoted wife, mother, grandmother and servant of Christ, whose life was marked by compassion, creativity and unwavering dedication to others. Her journey was one of selfless service—both in her home and in her community.
